How to manage contradictory requirements? How to gain efficiency with less costs?

Member State decision to plan new nuclear reactor should be based upon a commitment to use nuclear power for peaceful purposes, in a safe and secure manner. The legal instruments, internationally accepted nuclear safety standards, security guidelines and safeguards requirements are essential in establishing a responsible nuclear power programme. This seminar will focus on how to manage contradictory requirements and how to build effective national systems to manage safety, security, and safeguards being efficient and cost-effective at the same time.
